Former NFL Pro Bowler Jon Dorenbos isn't just an athlete—he's a master magician, a survivor of unthinkable tragedy, and a powerhouse motivational speaker. Best known for his 14-season career in the NFL, primarily with the Philadelphia Eagles, Jon made two Pro Bowl appearances before a routine trade to the New Orleans Saints in 2017 led to a life-changing

discovery. Doctors diagnosed him with a life-threatening heart condition, forcing him into emergency open-heart surgery and an abrupt retirement from football.

But Jon's story of resilience began long before the NFL. At just 12 years old, his world shattered when his father committed an unspeakable crime, leaving him to navigate the foster system alone. Searching for an escape, he turned to magic and sports, channeling his pain into passion. In 2016, he stunned audiences on America's Got Talent, making it to the finals and placing third among tens of thousands of competitors. His mind-bending sleight-of-hand performances caught the attention of Ellen DeGeneres, who became one of his biggest supporters.

Jon's bestselling book, *Life Is Magic*, shares his extraordinary journey from heartbreak to hope, offering a roadmap for overcoming adversity and choosing happiness. With over a decade of experience as a keynote speaker, he inspires audiences with his raw honesty, humor, and insight. Whether through storytelling, magic, or life lessons, Jon proves that even in life's darkest moments, there is room for transformation—and a little bit of magic.

About Us



THE VIRGINIA HOME is a private, nonprofit 130-bed facility that provides residential nursing and therapeutic care to adult Virginians living with physical disabilities. It is the only facility of its kind in Virginia—a pioneer in providing residential care for adults with physical disabilities.

The Home is a place where professional nursing care and specialized therapies form the cornerstone of service. Here, residents have the security of a supportive, multi-faceted organization right within their own home.

This unique community balances the support each resident needs with the rewards of living an independent life. The Virginia Home lends a permanent hand to those whose lives call for strength, courage and grace.

OUR MISSION is to provide compassionate, professional service and to ensure that the lifelong comfort and security of our residents will never be compromised, regardless of ability to pay for the care they receive.

THE HISTORY OF THE HOME begins with

Mary Tinsley Greenhow. Born into a prominent Virginia family, Mary was a teenager when she fell from a horse in the mid-1800s, leaving her with a paralyzing back injury from which she would never fully recover.

Mary was fortunate to have a family able to provide long-term care for her. In the years following her accident, she became increasingly concerned for people less fortunate and more seriously disabled than herself. She envisioned a place where people with physical disabilities could receive the

care and companionship they needed for the rest of their lives, and where their security and welfare would never be compromised.

Through her dedication and perseverance, The Virginia Home for Incurables was chartered and opened on March 1, 1894. Since then, The Virginia Home has grown and flourished through three changes of locale, several expansions and renovations, one name change and increased residential capacity.

THE VIRGINIA HOME IS GOVERNED by a volunteer Board of Trustees that works as a team with a professional staff to provide for the holistic well-being of each resident. The Junior Board also serves the residents in numerous meaningful ways throughout the year.

THE VIRGINIA HOME STAFF is a qualified, knowledgeable and caring group of men and women who seek to improve the physical, social and emotional

CELIA

Celia's warmth and positivity light up every room she enters. Born and raised in Richmond, she graduated from VA Tech and married her college sweetheart in 1979. She and her husband enjoyed two adventurous ski seasons in Vail, CO, before returning to Virginia, where she worked as a computer programmer for CVS.

A spirited middle child, Celia grew up between two sisters—five years younger than one and eight years older than the other. She has always had a love for sunshine, the beach, and

exploring new places. Family has been at the heart of her life, and she treasures memories of lively Christmas celebrations with her extended family.

Life took an unexpected turn when a serious illness led to surgery, bringing challenges that reshaped her path. Though the journey wasn't easy, Celia's resilience and warm spirit never wavered. Now at The Virginia Home, she embraces life with gratitude, surrounded by caring staff and a community that feels like family. She enjoys cooking, parties, and working with Brenda Mizelle, Speech Therapist, who has been instrumental in helping her communicate in new ways.

Before Celia moved to The Home, her sister Susan was her unwavering support, caring for both Celia and their other sister, who was born with Down Syndrome. With both parents gone, Susan thought Celia would feel at home quickly and thanks to a fun-filled trip to Nashville and the kindness of residents, she did. Moving to The Virginia Home has been a blessing for Celia and her family, bringing comfort, connection, and joy.

"I was born in Grafenwohr, Germany, where my dad was stationed in the Army. I grew up in Northern Virginia, near Mount Vernon, with my sisters, Kathy and Sharry.

"Some of my best memories are hunting and fishing with my dad and camping with my family at Sherando Lake. I was a Boy Scout and later joined Sigma Chi at UVA, where I studied engineering before my accident. One of my proudest moments was catching a 75-pound catfish in the James River— I even have a plaque to prove it!



"Today, I focus on speaking clearly and managing my health. I survived a traumatic brain injury 42 years ago, at age 21, and later worked for the Federal government for ten years. When my sister got the call that a spot at The Virginia Home had opened, I was cautiously excited. I was surprised by how much there is to do and that I can make my own schedule—especially in Physical Therapy, where I faithfully use the Intelliride bike! I enjoy many social activities on campus, visits from family and friends, and attending Mass. Last year, I went on a Travel Scholarship to Virginia Beach and cruised the James River—both unforgettable experiences."

Kathy and Sharry say Tom's smile, wit, and humor define him. His journey since his TBI in 1982 has been filled with challenges, but he remains resilient, patient, and grateful. A year after moving in, it's clear he has found his "forever home." His health has improved, and knowing TVH supports his well-being brings great peace of mind to his family.


